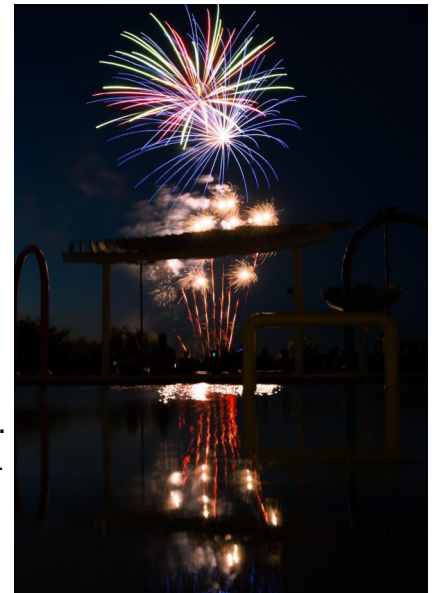

Revitalizing San Angelo: A Look into the TIRZ

San Angelo, a city known for its vibrant culture and rich history, has embarked on an ambitious journey to breathe new life into its urban core. At the heart of this revitalization effort is the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ), brought forth in 2009, a powerful tool designed to stimulate economic growth and urban renewal.

What is a TIRZ?

A Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone, or TIRZ, is a designated area where the property tax revenue is reinvested back into the zone. This mechanism provides a financial incentive for property owners and developers to invest in the area, leading to enhanced infrastructure, beautification projects, and increased business opportunities.

The Goals of San Angelo's TIRZ

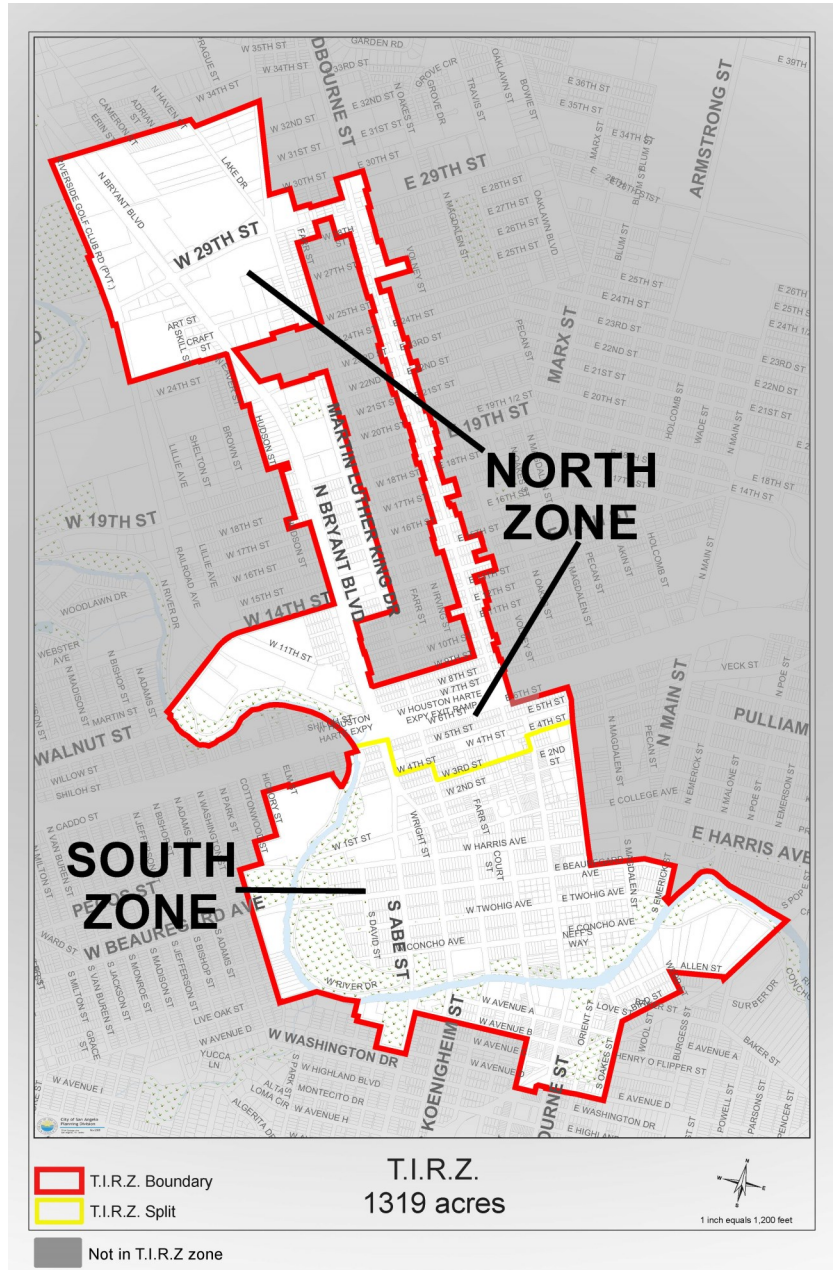
The primary goal of San Angelo's TIRZ is to transform underutilized and blighted areas into thriving economic hubs. By doing so, the city aims to:

Encourage Private Investment: Through various incentives, the TIRZ encourages private investors to develop properties, bringing new businesses, housing, and amenities to the area.

Preserve Historic Structures: Part of the TIRZ's mission is to maintain and repurpose historic buildings, preserving San Angelo's unique architectural heritage while providing modern uses.

Boost the Local Economy: Increased business activity within the TIRZ leads to job creation, a broader tax base, and a more vibrant local economy.

Not only would I do these graphics, I was also required to volunteer to help with their events. The work that is put in on these events is unbelievable, the amount of effort and energy everyone puts in is phenomenal. I've always enjoyed helping organize and set up events. From being on Student Council in high school, to helping my father cook for events at our church. There is a certain feeling of serotonin that I receive when I spend hours putting as much energy as possible into something and then getting to see the results. This would prove to be the same when helping with events for DTSA as well. Helping with events at DTSA such as Brews, ewes, & BBQ helped expand many of the skills I thought I was already efficient at. Not only was I learning new things but I was also able to improve who I was to begin with. From multitasking, remembering lists of tasks, to being creative and coming up with solutions for unexpected problems, I was able to mature and learn how to manage responsibility. Whether it was setting up for events or cleaning up after then it always got done. The best part of helping with these events is being able to attend them as well. I've enjoyed every hour I spent working this internship. It has been an opportunity like no other and I'd encourage anyone else who is interested in the opportunity to improve themselves and their future to seek out volunteering opportunities such as this one.

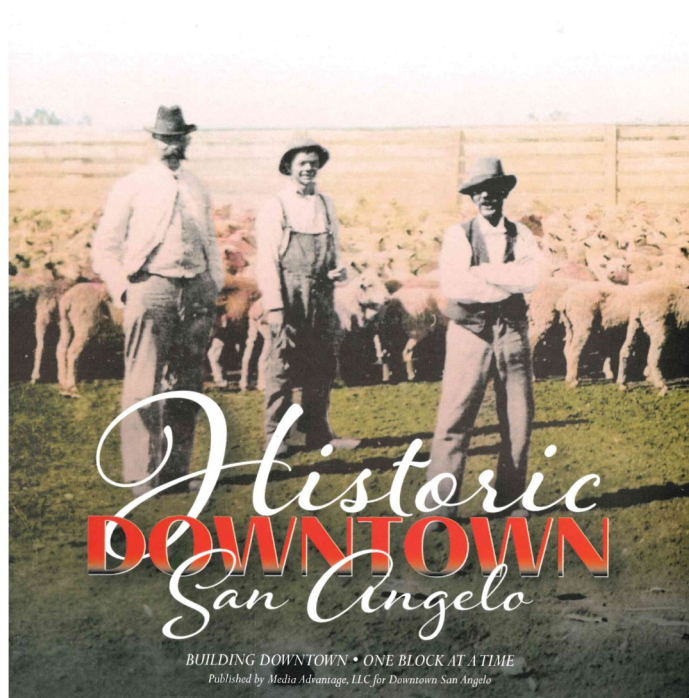

Established in 2004, Downtown San Angelo, Inc. was formed by a group of 35 individuals who were dedicated to downtown revitalization. In November 2005, the organization was granted membership in the Main Street Program. This program is a major effort by the National Trust for Historic Preservation to provide assistance to cities whose older central business districts are seeking to retain some vestige of their visual character and whose economic position is slipping. The premise of this program is that economic revitalization can take place within the context of historic preservation.
